Dear Senators Booker and Menendez:

On February 27th last, Senator Inhofe and Senator Duckworth introduced the National Center for the Advancement of Aviation Act of 2020 (S3360). Senators Rubio and Wyden have joined as co-sponsors. The Bill was referred to the Committee on Finance and read twice. The New Jersey Aviation Association strongly supports S3360 and encourages you to co-sponsor this legislation.

The purpose of the Center is to provide a forum to facilitate collaboration and cooperation between aviation and aerospace private sector stakeholders, including general, business, and commercial aviation, education, labor, manufacturing, the Armed Forces, and other governmental, non-governmental, and international organizations. It will support and promote civil and military aviation and aerospace in order to address the demands and challenges associated with ensuring a safe and vibrant national aviation system
